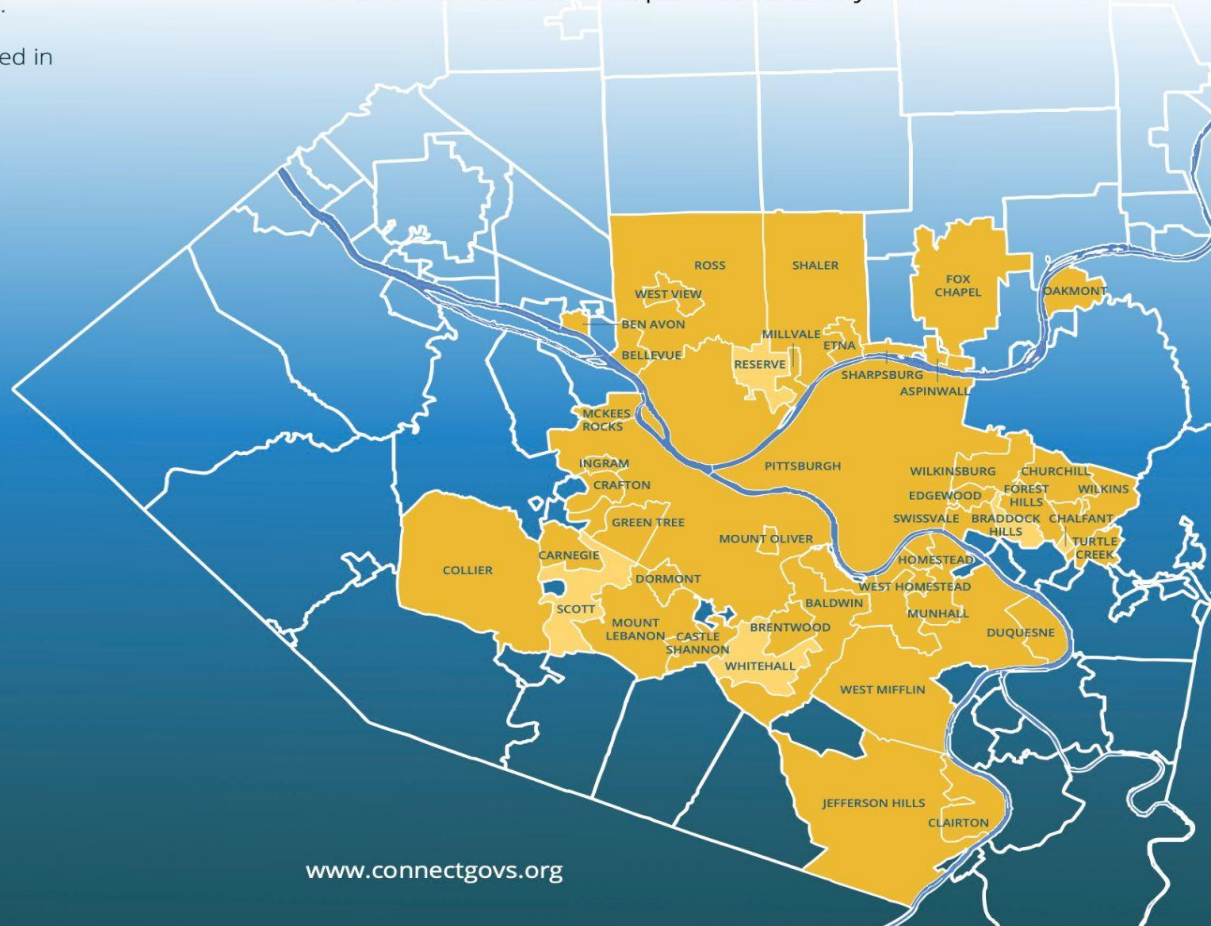

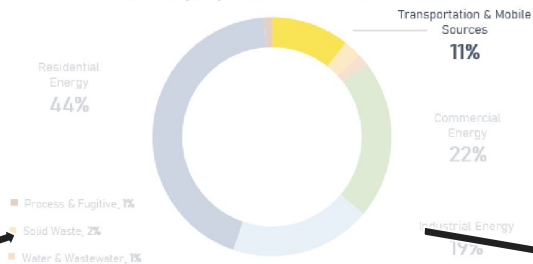

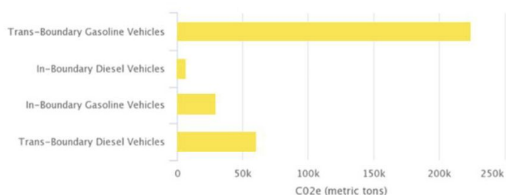


CONNECT's 2018 Greenhouse Gas Emissions

- Optional: attend additional lunch and learns about EV topics that interest you.

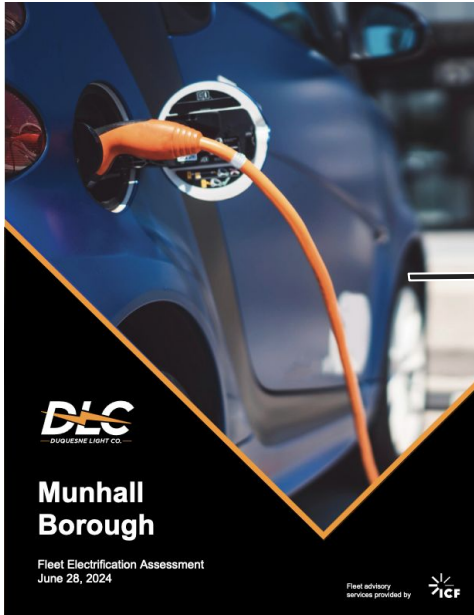

CUSTOM ROADMAPS FOR MUNICIPAL FLEETS



Based on our analysis, converting 23 vehicles to EVs is estimated to produce the following impacts:

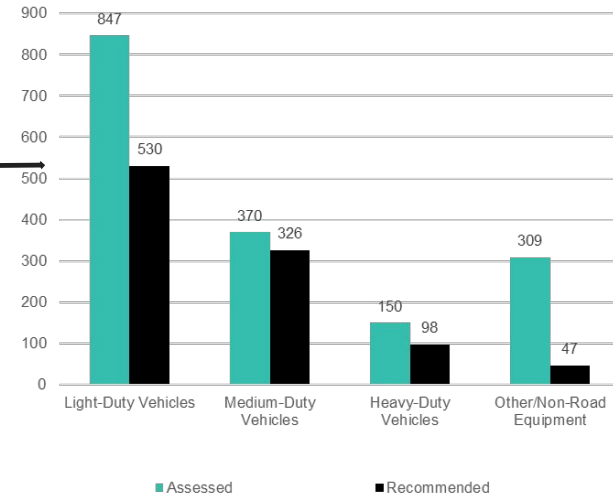
- \$2,132,364**
TCO savings over 23 years*
- \$743,194**
fuel cost savings over 23 years*
- \$512,105**
maintenance savings over 23 years*
- 3,903**
metric tons (MT) of CO₂ eliminated over 23 years

Over 23 years, those estimated CO₂ reductions equate to:

- eliminating **691** homes' energy use for one year, or:
- switching **228,202** incandescent lamps to LEDs, or:
- recycling **2,042** tons of waste instead of landfilling it, or:
- planting **99,088** trees.

* NPV assumes a 5% discount rate.

PLANNING

- Duquesne Light's 'Make Ready' program significantly subsidizes and simplifies public charging installation projects
- Seeking **IRA Funding** for both joint project across municipalities and individually
- PRCC provides grant writing support
- CONNECT developing joint programs and applications



OPPORTUNITIES AND CHALLENGES

Opportunities

- Strong partnerships with utility and Clean Cities and Communities Coalition
- Joint procurement
- Scaling impact
- IRA and PA State funding for EVs
- Increased adoption of EVs and EV fleets
- CONNECT providing project management support and capacity to small municipalities

Challenges

- Can be difficult without government lead
- Many ordinances, councils, lawyers across municipalities
- Ownership models, consistency and ongoing O+M
