




CUSTOM ROADMAPS FOR MUNICIPAL FLEETS









Based on our analysis, converting 23 vehicles to Over 23 years, those estimated CO2 reductions

EVs is estimated to produce the following impacts:


\$2,132,364 TCO savings over 23 years*






Opportunities

- Strong partnerships with utility and Clean Cities and Communities Coalition
- Joint procurement
- Scaling impact
- IRA and PA State funding for EVs
- Increased adoption of EVs and EV fleets
- CONNECT providing project management support and capacity to small municipalities

Challenges

- Can be difficult without government lead
- Many ordinances, councils, lawyers across municipalities
- Ownership models, consistency and ongoing O+M
